Treasurer Report

As Hospice SENB completes its third full year of operations at Maison Albert House, I am pleased to provide a summary of our financial position for 2024.

We began the year with an approved operating budget of \$3.5 million. While expenditures aligned closely with this budget, we experienced a revenue shortfall of approximately 400K, resulting in an overall deficit of 150K for the year. Most revenue sources met expectations; however, donations were slightly lower than in 2023 and represented much of the shortfall. This decline was due in part to changes in follow-up strategies with our established donor base but also reflected a broader transition from a capital campaign to a more traditional annual giving model. This shift has been reviewed, and updated strategies are now being implemented to strengthen our donor relationships and support future fundraising efforts.

Revenues from the Boutique Hospice Shoppe remained steady compared to the previous year. A full review of Shoppe operations has taken place, and enhancements have already been introduced to strengthen its contribution going forward.

Operationally, we made important strides in 2024. The introduction of the Chief Operating Officer role in late 2024 has significantly improved internal oversight and financial review processes. In parallel, we've continued refining our general ledger and budget structures to better reflect our operational realities.

I'm also pleased to note that these improvements have enabled us to meet our obligations for audited financial statements in time for the AGM - a meaningful step forward in accountability and transparency.

We are currently in the second year of a five-year funding agreement with the Province of New Brunswick's Department of Health, established through our Memorandum of Understanding. This agreement will continue through March 2028, providing a stable foundation for clinical operations.

Finally, I would like to thank the management team, staff - both past and present - and all those who support our mission.
